

The King James Bible

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Why I am a Bible Believer - The King James Bible is the Authorized Version: 1. It was translated under a King. 2. It was translated during a time before modernism. 3. It was translated by men who thought and said about themselves: "...because we are poor Instruments to make GODS holy Truth to be yet more and more known unto the people..."

Psalms 12:6-7, "The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever."

Of the Seven Generations of the Bible:

1. Hebrew Old Testament
2. Chaldean Parts of Old Testament (Aramaic)
3. Greek New Testament
4. Syrian Translation out of Antioch
5. Old Latin Translation (predates: Douay-Rheims or Jerome's Latin)
6. German Translation of Luther
7. The King James Bible: The Authorized Version 1611

Of the Seven English Bibles:

1. Coverdale's Bible (1535)
2. Matthews Bible (1537)
3. Tavernier's Bible (1539)
4. The Great Bible (1539)
5. The Geneva Bible (1557)
6. The bishop's Bible (1568)
7. The King James Bible (1611)

Note: Not included: William Tyndale's Bible (1525) much because he was murdered by Rome before his work was completed and the work was continued through the line above.

Of the Seven Editions of The King James Bible (There were three kinds of changes: proofreading or typos, printing or font type change, and orthographic spelling changes. In addition, there have been a number of changes of punctuation and case.):

1. 1611 Original
2. 1612-1613 Type Style Changes & Spelling Changes
3. 1617 Spelling Changes
4. 1629 Spelling Changes
5. 1637-1638 Spelling Changes
6. 1762 Spelling Changes
7. 1769 Spelling Changes

So we see of three sevens including the 1 section of the generations that the words of God were purified not revised, but editions were produced that corrected errors in transmission of the same text base: the text base was NEVER changed. The text base of all modern Bibles from 1881 to present are not even revisions because they are from a different text base. For this compare the text base of your King James Bible and your popular new age Bible like the NIV, NASV or ESV.

Luke 4:4, "...but by every word of God." is removed... So who doesn't want you to have every word of God? Look at verse 8 for that answer:

Luke 4:8, "...Get thee behind me, Satan..." is removed... So WHY would a rebuke to Satan be removed? What motive would there be in adding it to a text base? And what motive would there be in removing it? AH HA!

Why do all these versions agree against the King James Bible?

2 Corinthians 4:2-4, "But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them."

Satan is trying to HID the gospel, and blind the minds of them which believe not. He hates the souls of men, and wants them to burn in hell. It is in his best interest to pervert the Bible for this purpose.

2 Corinthians 11:3-4, "But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him." And 2 Corinthians 11:13-15, "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works."
