Someone said: "What is impossible with the reincarnation of the devil? Is there any verse that say reincarnation of the devil is impossible?"

Sargent answers: Where does reincarnation occur anywhere in the Bible? Yes reincarnation is impossible. It is a myth from some of the Eastern Religions like the Hindu belief in being re-born; and a hoax perpetrated on the body of Christ in place of sound doctrine. So if one can be reincarnated then anyone can be reincarnated and if anyone can be reincarnated then it would be possible that everyone WILL be reincarnated. Thus this delusion makes Christianity as pagan as Hindu and other pagan religions in the East that subscribe to reincarnation.

If someone is reincarnated then this verse is not possible: Hebrews 9:27, "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment..." And the word incarnate would mean a preexisting person putting flesh back on himself or that the body is an avatar when you drop one off you put on another.

No souls are preexistent. The ONLY preexistent person incarnated in the Bible is the Lord Jesus Christ. John 1:1-4, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men." And John 1:14, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."

The incarnation would be the phrase here "...the Word was made flesh..." This is NEVER a statement given to ANYONE else ever. Satan will counterfeit this; which means he will NOT accomplish this in reality but will lie about his son being reincarnated. Even Jesus Christ was NOT reincarnated; He was incarnated; and then rose from the dead. The resurrection from the dead is NOT a reincarnation. It is a resurrection FROM the dead. A reincarnation would be that the soul in a body departs at the body's death; and enters into another body being born physically into this world. This is NOT what is happening EVER.

So the question above is: "Is there any verse that says reincarnation of the devil is impossible?" As a Bible Believer the answer to this is NO. However, because this question is one of "the Bible doesn't say so; therefore it must be true!" is not a proper questioning. Just because the Bible does NOT say something does not

necessitate its truth. The Bible doesn't say a lot of things; so what. How does that make you a Bible Believer? The antithesis of a TRUTH can be assumed true in reverse of what IS given. However this is not a sure thing. In the case of Satan a master deceiver whose son will be a LIE will inevitably deceive people into believing a LIE. A lie is NOT the truth. Just because some religions teach reincarnation does not make it true because the Bible doesn't say "...there is no such thing as reincarnation." If you physically die once and then the JUDGMENT takes place thereafter; that would preclude any reentering into another body to die again; and miss said judgment. The fact is Judas Iscariot died went to hell and will be raised up at the second resurrection during the Great White Throne Judgment and then cast into the Lake of Fire. The Antichrist who is the man of sin and the son of perdition also known as the beast gets cast ALIVE into the lake of fire with the false prophet: Revelation 19:20, "And the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had received the mark of the beast, and them that worshipped his image. These both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone."

So the Bible does say some things that make reincarnation a lie. I gave one already. The fact that no one but the Lord Jesus Christ was made flesh ergo: incarnated being that He had preexistence precludes the term of reincarnation which would mean that this happens twice (or more). Yet no one but Christ has this happened to ONCE! You were not incarnated; you did not exist prior to your existence in the flesh. Now if Judas went to hell as a lost person and is reincarnated he would have to have been incarnated prior to being reincarnated and therefore:

- 1. Why does the Bible NOT say so?
- 2. Why is the name of the Antichrist left out?
- 3. Why is there no passage about reincarnation in reference to the son of Satan?
- 4. Why would God allow a human that ended up in hell be raised out and born in the flesh again? Doesn't that make the son of Satan "born again" physically? What if he came up from the underworld wouldn't that be a resurrection from the dead?
- 5. If any of this were true then the Bible WOULD SAY SO.
- 6. Absence from the Bible is only a criterion in which to build up a falsehood. (Peter shot his wife with a shotgun! Well, the Bible didn't say he didn't; so he must have! This is ridiculous non-sense.)
- 7. The Lord God Almighty is NOTHING like Satan. To make a 100% antithesis of the two is to add to the scriptures. Satan is nothing like the Lord God Almighty; and his son is nothing like the Son of God!

God is Absolute Truth – Satan is the LIE which can be 99.999 % truth. The son of Satan is a lie so you will be deceived by him if you think that he is like the Lord Jesus Christ. The trouble is there are many sons of Satan. As a matter of fact every lost person is a child of the devil. Acts 13:10, "And said, O full of all subtilty and all mischief, thou child of the devil, thou enemy of all righteousness, wilt thou not cease to pervert the right ways of the Lord?" and John 8:44, "Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it." And Ephesians 2:1-3, "And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins; Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others." And Ephesians 5:6, "Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience." And Colossians 3:6-7, "For which things' sake the wrath of God cometh on the children of disobedience: In the which ye also walked some time, when ye lived in them." And Acts 26:18, "To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me." And 2 Thessalonians 2:9-12, "Even him, whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders, And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness."

Read these verses carefully: Colossians 1:12-18, "Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins: Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature: For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist. And he is the head of the body, the

church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence."

God is Righteous and Holy – Satan is transformed into an angel of light and his ministers are ministers of righteousness. That does not make Satan the light of God anymore his ministers are righteous. Yet this would not imply that Satan has the power to reincarnate when God never does this. This does not imply that Satan has the power to incarnate; but ONLY God has done this in the Bible. There is no verse where Satan or the son of Satan is "made flesh" in the same way as the Lord Jesus Christ is the incarnate Word.

God's Son was with Him in the beginning – Satan was Lucifer: a created spirit being Ezekiel 28:14-17, "Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou hast walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in thee. By the multitude of thy merchandise they have filled the midst of thee with violence, and thou hast sinned: therefore I will cast thee as profane out of the mountain of God: and I will destroy thee, O covering cherub, from the midst of the stones of fire. Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee." Satan's son will be a human that is completely sold out to Satan and LIKE Judas will have an unclean familiar spirit of antichrist inside. Judas is one of the greatest types of this; but he is NOT the same PERSON (soul). Now if you can find where reincarnation IS in the Bible then you can join the Hindu religion with your Bible and worship those devils.

The absence of reincarnation in the Bible is not a basis on which to make any fact that reincarnation is true. If one could be reincarnated, then why not everyone? The Bible doesn't say anything about that either: so it MUST be true; right? NO! A Bible Believer does NOT take what the Bible does NOT say and make that a believable doctrine! A Bible Believer: OH! Believes what the Bible SAYS! Not what it does NOT say! Err Duh!
