There are three major heresies that were produced by the Romanist Jesuits that have infiltrated the Protestant Local Churches.

- 1. Calvinism Classic 6 point Calvinism
- 2. Baptismal Regeneration Water Baptism is essential to Salvation
- 3. Hyper-Dispensationalism A Dispensation called "the Grace of God"

There are many other heresies however these are the ones that confuse people and lead them away from the truth. Here I will be dealing with Hyper-Dispensationalism and the destructive nature of this philosophy.

#### What Hyper-Dispensationalist Teach:

- There is a time period called "The Grace of God" which began in Act 9 if you follow these teachers: Stam, Baker, Moore or Watkins. It began in Acts 13 if you follow these teachers: O'Hare and some others. It began in Acts 28 if you follow these teachers: Bullinger, Ballanger or Greaterex. This obviously shows that the Hypers are not all in agreement as to WHEN this time started; which is the very foundation of their teachings.
- 2. Water Baptism is not for "This Age" since "This Age" began in Acts 9 or 13 or 18 or 28.
- 3. Bible Believing Baptist are heretics who do not follow "Pauline" teaching (1 Timothy 1:16)
- 4. Since Paul did not command anyone to be baptized, it is unscriptural.
- 5. Since Paul was not "sent to baptize" then water baptism is pre-Pauline (1 Corinthians 1.)
- 6. The "one baptism" of Ephesians 4 automatically cancels water baptism according to Moore, Stam, Sharpe and Baker.

#### The Bible View and Rebuke for the Hyper- Dispensationalist

- 1. The "Dispensation" of Ephesians 3:2 was the grace God gave to Paul to preach: Ephesians 3:7; 1 Corinthians 3:10; Colossians 1:29. Grace was "dispensed" to him. The "grace of God" is found in every period of time: Genesis 6:8; Exodus 33:13.
- The age of the "One Body" and the "Church of the one body" began in Matthew 27. See Ephesians 2:12, 16; with 12 Apostles "in Christ" Romans 16:7; before Paul was saved: John 17:21 & 23.
- 3. Paul was baptized in water in Acts 9:18 and baptized some of his converts in Acts 16:33; 18:8; 1 Corinthians 1:14-16; even though he was an evangelist.
- 4. Paul commanded no one to attend church, pass out tracts, proselyte Baptist who are already saved, or argue about water baptism.
- 5. He did baptize in 1 Corinthians 1:14-16 and only thanked God that people weren't baptized in his name: 1 Corinthians 1:14-18. Paul was not sent by Mark 16:16-18. He is the only Apostle who fulfilled that commission.

6. The Corinthian converts who were baptized by one Spirit into one Body in 1 Corinthians 12:13 were baptized in water in Acts 18:8.

#### The Hyper-Dispensationalist's Perversion of Ephesians 4:5

Stam, Baker, Bullinger, Ballinger and Moore all take Ephesians 4:4-5 out of the context in which it appears just like any Cambelite does and pretend that it is talking about water baptism being replaced by spirit baptism. This explains why 95% of any "hyper" congregation are ex-Baptist.

The context of Ephesians 4:4-6 is the unity of the Body of Christ, not disunity caused by carnal Christians who say: "I am of Christ" 1:12.

The same baptism that put Paul into Christ ("WE" in 1 Corinthains12:13 put Gentile Believers in Christ.

The same baptism that put "the 12" into Christ in Acts 1:5 also put the Roman converts into Christ in Romans 6:1-3 and 16:17.

# **One Baptism**

Hyper-Dispensationalists teach two or three baptisms of the Spirit, although the context of ONE Baptism is ONE Sprit: Ephesians 4:4-5.

There are seven baptisms in the Bible: Hebrews 6:2 the doctrine of baptisms:

- 1. 1 Corinthians 10:2 baptized unto Moses in the cloud and in the sea
- The baptism of John: Water Baptism unto repentance: Matthew 3:6, 11; 13-16; 21:25; Mark 1:4; 11:30; Luke 3:3, 7, 12, 16, 21; 7:29-30; 20:4; John 1:25-33; ((Acts 1:3, 22; 10:37; 11:16; 13:24; 18:25; 19:3-4) & (John 3:22-26; 4:1-2) & (Acts 2:38, 41; 8:12-16; 10:37; 13:24)).
- 3. Christ's baptism of suffering: Matthew 20:22-23; Mark 10:38-39; Luke 12:50; Philippians 1:29; 3:10.
- 4. The Great Commission baptism: Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:16.
- Christ baptize with: The Holy Ghost (Spirit): For the Wheat: Matthew 3:11-12; Luke 3:16-17; Acts 1:5; Acts 11:16; 1 Corinthians 12:13; Galatians 3:27; Ephesians 4:5; 1 Peter 3:18-22; (Baptized into Jesus Christ's death: Romans 6:3-4; 1 Corinthians 15:28-34; Philippians 3:10; Colossians 2:12).
- Believers Water Baptism: Acts 8:36-38; Acts 9:18; Acts 10:47-48; Acts 16:15; Acts 16:30-34; Acts 18:8; Acts 19:5; 1 Corinthians 1:13-17; (Baptized into Jesus Christ's death: Romans 6:3-4; 1 Corinthians 15:28-34; Philippians 3:10; Colossians 2:12).
- 7. Christ baptize with: Fire: For the Chaff with FIRE: Matthew 3:11-12; Luke 3:16-17; Revelation 20:14-15.

Where water is mentioned like in John 3:5-7 it does not mean water baptism and where baptism is mentioned like in Romans 6:3 it doesn't mean water baptism and in some cases it is both Spirit Baptism and water baptism because Believer's Baptism is a testimony to that Spirit Baptism that already happened.

There are many lords and gods: 1 Corinthians 8:5-6, "For though there be that are **called gods**, whether in heaven or in earth, (as **there be gods many**, and **lords many**,) But **to us** there is but **one God**, **the Father**, of whom **are** all things, and **we in him**; and **one Lord Jesus Christ**, **by** whom are all things, and we **by** him." And Ephesians 4:3-6, "Endeavouring to **keep the unity** of the Spirit **in the bond of peace**. There is **one body**, and **one Spirit**, even as ye are called in **one hope** of your calling; **One Lord**, **one faith**, **one baptism**, **One God** and **Father** of all, who is **above all**, and **through all**, and **in you all**."

# The False Teachings of Hyper-Dispensationalists

- 1. "Peter and Paul preached different Gospels." If they did then Peter was cursed according to Galatians 1:8-9. God taught Peter the Gospel in Acts 10:43, which he publicly acknowledges in Acts 15:11, while all are practicing John's water baptism.
- "Repentance should not be preached in this age." Paul preached it constantly in Acts 20:21 and asked exactly what John the Baptist asked for when the preached it in Acts 26:20. Paul did this after writing Romans 16:25-26.
- "The 'body' could not have been at Pentecost because no one mentioned it." Neither did anyone mention the complete abolition of the Levitical Law or the fulfilling of the Law: Acts 13:38-40 though both were accomplished facts: Colossians 2:14-15; Acts 13:38-40.
- 4. "Matthew 28:19-20 is limited to the Tribulation." Pure conjecture (1 Timothy 6:3 is written to saints in "the one body"). The crucifixion instruction which is apparent to anyone by comparing Matthew 10:1-10 with Matthew 28:19-20 and John 13-17. The Tribulation had not begun in 33 AD. Notice the "…unto the end of the world."
- 5. "Paul was deceived about water baptism and the 'one body' until he wrote Ephesians 3-4 after Acts 28." Then he sinned against God in not confessing it. He sinned against you in not telling you straight out in plain clear-cut commands. 1 Thessalonians 5 and Romans 14; not to make the same mistake. Every Christian leader in the New Testament was baptized in water: none of them "repented" of this action.

# The "Congregation" of the Hyper "Congregation"

- 1. Men who were called to preach but chickened out because of:
  - a. Financial reasons because of no faith
  - b. Laziness because of no zeal
  - c. Being afraid to speak up publicly against sin and sins because of no courage.
- 2. Men who cannot preach but want to attract attention as a "Bible Authority."
- 3. Young men and women who are dating (or have married) a "hyper" and have to espouse the heresy in order to "get along" with the "object of their affections."

- 4. All Hyper preachers as well as Campbellite elders, Charismatics, Calvinist and papists spend their "ministries" trying to put young men out of soul winning work of the ministry.
- 5. All Hyper-Dispensationalist have an "anti-Baptist fixation" which so obsesses them that they are forced to argue about water baptism every time they meet a new Christian. The same can be said for Campbellites, Charismatics, Calvinist, Mormons, JWs, 7<sup>th</sup> Day-Adventists, Yahwehites / Yeshuaites and Papists Jesuits Romans from where all these heretical teachings come.

Summary:
