And there was yet a battle in Gath, where was a man of <u>great stature</u>, that had on every hand <u>six fingers</u>, and on every foot <u>six toes</u>, four and twenty in number; and he also was born to the <u>giant</u>. And when he defied Israel, Jonathan the son of Shimea the brother of David slew him. These <u>four</u> were born to the <u>giant</u> in <u>Gath</u>, and fell by the hand of David, and by the hand of his servants."

Isaiah 20:1, "In the year that Tartan came unto Ashdod, (when Sargon the king of Assyria sent him,) and fought against <u>Ashdod</u>, and took it;"

The names of cities were named after people who were named after their gods which were the product of the angels that fell prior to the flood in Noah's time. The gods are associated with people that were named after them. The gods come from the angels that lost their first estate. The sons of God that joined with the daughters of men and had children that died in the flood as did the sons of God and the daughters of men. However the children that came from that union is said of them that they were men of renown but because they were spirit beings with bodies and when they died like men they came out on the other side of the flood as disembodied spirits. Satan that deceived the sons of God while traveling with the sons of God (Job 1 & 2) also recruited their children after the flood but only recruited a few. They became the devils that are trying to inhabit other people through spiritual subjugation through idol worship. Satan will recruit more during the tribulation time and the devilment will step up its pace.

These Genealogies are not complete, and is not meant to be an accurate representation of or a complete truth. There is too many loose ends and make the lines disconnected. What this does show is the connection to all the gods, and the nations who espouse the worship of these devils.

The pagan practices of these nations in things like passing of their sons and daughter through fire to their gods. Idol worship leads to the worst pagan practices like bloodletting involved in tattooing or piercings, drinking human blood, eating human flesh.

1 John 5:21, "Little children, **keep yourselves from idols**. Amen." Not all idols are made out of stone, metal, rock, or physical things. If you put something in the way of your worship of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, you have an idol in your heart. You can fight it by the words of God: Psalms 119:11, "**Thy word have I hid** <u>in mine heart</u>, that I <u>might not sin</u> against thee." Be careful of your heart: Proverbs 4:23, "**Keep thy heart** with all diligence; for **out of it are the issues of life**."
