Instructions: This is a multiple choice test: **circle** (a) (b) or (c) for your answer. This is an open Bible test if you need to read the context of the passages given. Remember I am looking for the answer **in the passage given** therefore any deviation from the text given could be marked as wrong. There is only ONE right answer to these questions. Be careful that you **do not** answer these questions with any private interpretation as some of the answers listed are from those points of view. Remember **the answer is IN the passage given** and the questions are asked “**According to**” that passage given. If you go outside of the passage listed then you are not answering the question. Pay attention to detail and words: **only a 100% tests will be awarded a certificate** of completion. Written out answers will not be counted as answers. **Read the whole test before starting** and if you have any questions come up to the front and ask the instructor privately as not to disturb the others taking the test. Completion should take about 30 minutes. Again: **read the whole test before starting.**

1. According to Romans 16:25-27; how do you OBEY God in the Church Age?

“Now to him that is of power to stablish you according to my gospel, and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery, which was kept secret since the world began, But now is made manifest, and by the scriptures of the prophets, according to the commandment of the everlasting God, made known to all nations for the obedience of faith: To God only wise, be glory through Jesus Christ for ever. Amen.”

- a. By the works of the Law.
- b. By repenting of sins and getting baptized in water.
- c. For the obedience of faith.

2. According to 1 Timothy 3:16; who is Jesus Christ?

In particular to each question; where it is: in the passage and what it says; in the given verse. **There are no religious or denominational persuasions implied herein** and there are no deviations from **the Authorized Version of the Bible**. The only Bible that will be used in this test will be **the King James Bible** (not the new one) and any deviations from this text in the test or your answers are not deemed as accurate.

Failure to take your own test or in any way look on another person’s test is considered cheating. Please work according to the Bible: 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12, “And **that ye study to be quiet**, and to **do your own business**, and to **work with your own hands**, as we commanded you; **That ye may walk honestly** toward them that are without, and that ye may have lack of nothing.” And with: Romans 12:17, “Recompense to no man evil for evil. **Provide things honest in the sight of all men.**” And with: 2 Corinthians 8:21, “**Providing for honest things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men.**” Please do not give me any occasion to ask you to leave the class for cheating.
